1. *Wild Mahseer, a heritage stay named after one of the toughest game fish in the world, offers visitors a unique experience of mindful tourism amidst the biodiverse haven of the Eastern Himalayan Botanic Ark.*
2. *The 22-acre property features the Burra Bungalow, five cozy tea bungalows, a dining pavilion, conference facility, and Elephant Country and The Nursery*
3. *The property is home to over 100,000 plants, 90+ bird species, and 72+ butterfly species, and serves as a gateway to national parks like Kaziranga 6th Addition, Pakke, Nameri, and Orang*
4. *Wild Mahseer is also a diverse cultural hub, surrounded by eight ethnic communities from Indo-Tibet and Indo-Myanmar regions, and the Tea tribe communities who migrated from Central Bengal a century ago.*

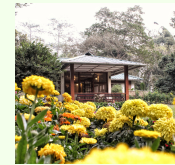
Vision

EXPERIENCE THE LUXURY OF THE COLONIAL LIFESTYLE

***The Burra Bungalow** is a certified heritage property steeped in over 100 years of rich history as the original Visiting Agent's Bungalow was built in 1874.*

***Ambrosia** was constructed in 1959 to house the then-chief accountant. This 4,500 square feet bungalow has been completely renovated and refurbished in the year 2019.*

***Golden Tips** built in the 1920s, in the 3,200 square meter compound, was the Group Engineer's bungalow and has been renovated twice in 2004 and 2017. It is accessed by a long driveway surrounded by a beautiful garden and bamboo hedge*

***Silver Tips** is a 3-bedroom bungalow set in a 1,200+ square meter compound. Formerly known as Charduar Lodge, this guest house was once Doctor Sahib's Bungalow constructed in the late 90s. It has been renovated twice in 2004 and 2015.*

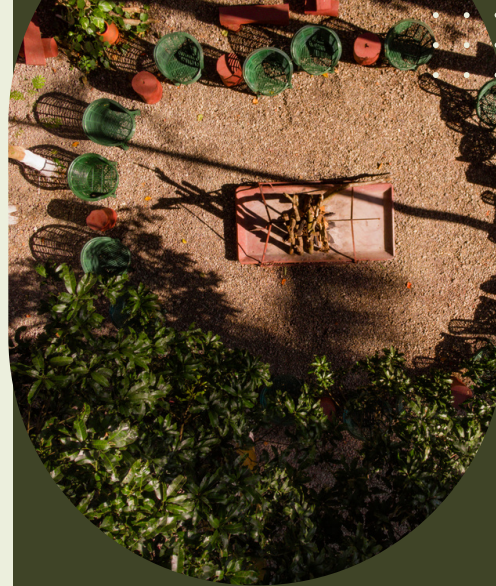


***Camellia Bungalow** was the visiting agent's office block comprising office rooms for Doctor Sahib, the company accountant, and their clerical staff and a separate meeting room. These 4 office rooms have been turned into 4 luxurious bedrooms. The bungalow has been in existence since 1924.*

***The Cottage** was built as an Annexe to the Burra bungalow in 1930's to accommodate special guests of the visiting agents. A perfect stay for couples with a private bonfire.*



The First Flush Dining Hall was then a garage for tractors and has been converted to a 28-seater world-class dining space paneled with French Doors embedded with glass to let sunlight through! During monsoons, feel the fresh air and cool droplets of rain sprinkling outdoors with a lush green cover. You can also relish the exquisite fusion of Eastern Himalayan Food and British Assam flavors amidst breathtaking natural beauty.

Serenely tucked in the Brahmaputra valley and nurtured by the local communities of the Eastern Himalayas, the Eastern Himalayan Botanic Ark in residence at Wild Mahseer is an elusive natural and cultural paradise.

Located 25 kms away from India's cleanest city, Tezpur, Wild Mahseer is a bio-diverse Ark of 1,00,000+ plants, 90+ species of birds and 72+ species of butterflies and is also the gateway to the forests of Pakke, Kaziranga, Nameri and Orang. Imbued in history on a 22-acre land, it comprises of the Burra (visiting agent's) Bungalow (3 rooms), a mute spectator of the tea heritage that allows visitors to immerse in the nostalgia of the colonial lifestyle. Along with an additional 5 cosy tea bungalows with One cottage (total 18 rooms), the First Flush dining pavilion and Two & A Bud conference facility all located on a certified organic property.
